



DRESS CODE (MEN) ON THE COURSE

- **Smart recognised golf apparel must be worn at all times.**
- **Caps** - All caps should be worn with the peak at the front.
- **Shirts** - Golf shirts must have collars, with either long or short sleeves (round/crew neck golf shirts are acceptable). Rugby/football shirts are prohibited, as are shirts carrying logos, slogans, numbers or illustrations on apparel that are not golf related.
- **Trousers** - Must be tailored and appropriate for golf. All types or colour of denim, paramilitary or camouflage style trousers, combat trousers (multiple pockets), cut-offs or tracksuits are strictly prohibited.
- **Shorts** - Shorts to be tailored or of appropriate golf attire.
- **Socks** - Shorts must be worn with socks, which, if long (to the knee) must be of a single plain colour. Short socks must be predominantly white in colour. Training shoe socks are permitted.
- **Shoes** - Only shoes designed for the purpose of playing golf are permitted.

DRESS CODE (LADIES) ON THE COURSE

- **Smart recognised golf apparel must be worn at all times.**
- **Caps** - All caps should be worn with the peak at the front.
- **Shirts** - Collarless shirts/tops must have sleeves. Sleeveless shirts/tops must have collars and must have a modest neck line. Shirts worn outside must be designed for that purpose and at his length. Halter neck tops and tank tops are not permitted.
- **Trousers** - Must be tailored and appropriate for golf. All types or colour of denim, paramilitary or camouflage style trousers, combat trousers (multiple pockets), cut off or tracksuits are strictly prohibited.
- **Shorts** - Shorts to be tailored or of appropriate golf attire.
- **Skirts** - Golf skirts/culottes are permitted.
- **Socks** - Shorts must be worn with socks which, if long (to the knee) must be of a single plain colour. Short socks must be predominantly white in colour. Training shoe socks are permitted.
- **Shoes** - Only shoes designed for the purpose of playing golf are permitted.



ETIQUETTE ON THE COURSE

- Inappropriate language and behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Mobile phones should be switched off or on silent.
- Please repair pitch marks, rake bunkers and replace divots.
- No trolleys or buggies on greens, tees, fringes or between green side bunkers and green.
- Avoid slow play at all times. Keep pace with the game in front. **Respect** other golfers and allow games through if yours is causing delays.

DRESS CODE AND ETIQUETTE IN THE CLUBHOUSE

- Inappropriate language and behaviour will not be tolerated.
- Mobile phones in the clubhouse bar and lounge should be used with discretion.
- Smart casual dress is essential. Please change from working clothes if these risk transgressing our dress code.
- Shorts to be tailored, or of appropriate golf attire, socks with shorts are required (ankle socks allowed).
- No camouflage pattern of any description.

- Clean washed jeans are permitted, except on designated club meetings (e.g. Annual General Meeting).
- Sandals and flip flops may be worn in the clubhouse with shorts or skirts (socks are not required to be worn).
- Trainers may be worn in the clubhouse.
- No golf shoes in clubhouse.
- No hats to be worn in clubhouse.
- The clubhouse and patio areas are No Smoking Zones, this includes e-cigarettes.

USE OF PRACTICE AREAS

- The Putting Area at the side of the Pro Shop is to be used for putting only.
- The area at the top of the car park is for putting, chipping and bunker practice.
- There is also an area to the right of the 5th Tee which is suitable for practising woods.

RESPONSIBILITY

It is the responsibility of all playing members to familiarise themselves with the Rules of Golf and the Handicap system. (There are handbooks of rules located around the club and some recommended web site addresses listed below to help with this).

New members are asked to call at the Pro shop prior to their first round to introduce themselves, pick up some guidance on requirements and to take the opportunity to ask any relevant questions about the Club or Course

- The standard of dress and general appearance will at all times determine the entitlement of members, their guests and visitors to

use the facilities of the clubhouse and course and will be consistent with the dignity of the club.

- Failure to comply with our regulations could lead to possible suspension or exclusion from the club.
- Members are requested to assist in the maintenance of these standards by politely pointing out any deviations from the club rules to fellow players

Dress etiquette on the course

NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Football or Rugby shirts
- Shirts pulled outside trousers
- Denim jeans
- Sports shorts
- Beach shorts
- Trousers tucked into socks
- Training shoes

ACCEPTABLE

- Men's shirts must have a collar short or long sleeves.
- Turtle neck / Roll neck acceptable
- Shirts tucked into trousers
- Tailored shorts
- Long trousers
- Long or short socks to be worn with shorts
- Golf shoes

WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE COURSE



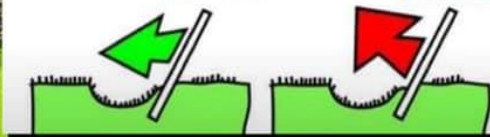
Repair your pitch marks!

Pushing the bottom of the depression upward only tears the roots, and kills the grass.

Right: Using the prongs to push grass at the edge of the depression toward the centre



Wrong: Using the prongs as levers to push up the bottom of the depression
